

Manifestation Determination

When a student enrolled in the Special Education program receives disciplinary action, the IEP team meets to determine if the student's actions were a result of their disability. This is called a manifestation determination review (MDR).

Manifestation Determination

Before the IEP team meets, they will need to invite the parents to the meeting.

Steps *To invite the parents:*

- 1. Create a Notification of Conference (rev 8/24).
- 2. Enter the date.
- 3. Provide meeting details, including date, time, and location.
- 4. Indicate that the purpose of the conference is **Manifestation Determination Review**.
- 5. Fill out the rest of the document and add a signature.
- 6. Share the document with the parents.
- 7. Mark the document complete.

At the meeting, the IEP team should review all relevant information and make a manifestation determination.

Steps To conduct a Manifestation Determination Review:

- 1. Create an Individualized Education Program (rev 7/22).
- 2. Enter the date.
- 3. Select Manifestation Determination for the purpose of conference.
- 4. In Section R, click add Manifestation Determination.
- 5. Summarize relevant information.

6. Decide whether:

- The conduct was caused by or had a direct and substantial relationship to the student's disability.
- The conduct was the direct result of the school district's failure to implement the IEP.
- 7. Make a determination about whether the behavior was or was not a manifestation of their disability.
- 8. Fill out the rest of the document and add signatures on the Cover page.
- 9. Mark the document complete.

After the meeting, the team should send a formal communication of the results to the parents.

Steps *To notify the parents of recommendations:*

- 1. Create a **Notification of Conference Recommendations**.
- 2. Enter the date.
- 3. Provide meeting details.
- 4. Select the appropriate determination:
 - Was determined that the disciplinary code violation(s) was related to your child's disability or
 - Was determined that the disciplinary code violation(s) was not related to your child's disability
- 5. Fill out the rest of the document and add a signature.
- 6. Share the document with the parents.
- 7. Marked complete.

If the behavior was a manifestation of the student's disability, the team must:

- Review and revise the student's IEP
- Conduct a Functional Behavioral Assessment if one has not been completed yet
- Create or modify/review the Behavior Intervention Plan

If the behavior was not a manifestation of the student's disability, the district may apply relevant disciplinary procedures in the same manner as students without a disability.
